The occupational Health and Safety Assessment Series was developed under the direction of the British Standard Institution (BSI) in cooperation with various international certification associations. This certification is in line with our Principles for quality, occupational health and safety, binding for all employees at all the locations of the **RENOLIT** Group as of February 2009.

Vinyl 2010 is the legal entity created in 2000 to implement a ten-year voluntary program for Sustainable Development by the whole of the European PVC industry, involving PVC manufacturers, PVC additive producers and PVC converters.

It is recognized globally as being a unique example of a partnership initiative by all of the players in a single product value chain and has been recognized as a Partnership for Sustainable Development by the United Nations.

It has a clear set of targets set out in the European PVC Industry's Voluntary Commitment (covering projects, initiatives and research studies primarily concerning environmental protection and resource management); has an independent monitoring committee; and publishes a report each year on its progress.
